## Saratoga Springs Rotary Education Foundation awards \$85,000 in scholarships to local students

Established in 1997, the Saratoga Springs Rotary Education Foundation raises funds to support the post-secondary education and vocational training of graduates from public and private high schools in the greater Saratoga community. The annual awards event, held this year at Skidmore College, is the Foundation's major fundraiser and all proceeds go to fund future scholarships.
